the firms featured in this chapter are active in the international regulation of the import and export of goods, services and rights, as well as the complex maze of regulations governing EU market regulation, export control and customs. On an international level, many firms also focus on international commercial law and World Trade Organization (WTO) regulations. Since law firms with offices in Brussels often play an important role in this field, the reader is advised to consult the remesponding chapter. More information on civil law advice and international contract drafting mu be found in the bdistribution and franchising chapter, Similarly, lawyers with experience in intration and commercial disputes can be found in the chapter on dispute resolution.

Developments

The economic mood surrounding companies over the past year was shaped by foreign business: on the one hand through careful observation of the economic development in the US and on the wher hand by turning hopefully towards the most important Asian markets in China and India. where the manufacturing industry is experiencing a steady boom. German auto suppliers discovmed the Chinese retail market a long time ago and now, conversely, Chinese auto manufacturers me about to conquer the European market. Companies which import and export have to adhere to increasingly complex regulations, embargos and antiterrorism lists. If, as an entrepreneur, someone does not follow these rules carefully, then that person could end up on the US sanction list and so longer be permitted to enter the country. In addition to ongoing advice on customs and export controls, compliance has also made its way into this practice field, as lawyers report increasing demand for advice here. Trade disputes were subject to very much discussion last year, namely hose whose outcome was based on ICSID arbitration rules, WTO rules or bilateral investment protection agreements. The failure of the WTO Doha Development Round, due to differences in opinion regarding agricultural trade and the abolition of subsidies and customs duties, could mean that bilateral agreements may have a greater role to play in the future.

This seemingly very international practice area is in no way a domain for large international firms only. On the contrary, in the German market a number of smaller firms with a strong international settip are active here. In customs and market regulations, for instance, this includes Ehle & Schiller from Cologne. The firm secured a much observed judgment against the European Commission if the dispute concerning Italian and Turkish customs issues, which holds the EU authorities accountable for resolving corruption. In terms of export controls, Hohmann & Partner and Oppenholf & Partner are some of the most renowned specialists, whereas Bernzen Sonntag continues up be known for WTO issues. Particularly impressive, however, was Graf von Westphalen, as the firm refused to rest on its laurels in its top position and continually developed other practice areas instead. The firm was also active for some auto suppliers in international distribution, as well as for numerous companies in customs and export compliance.
